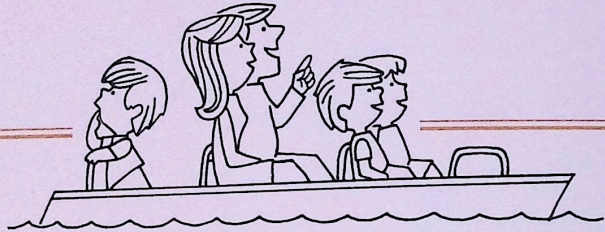

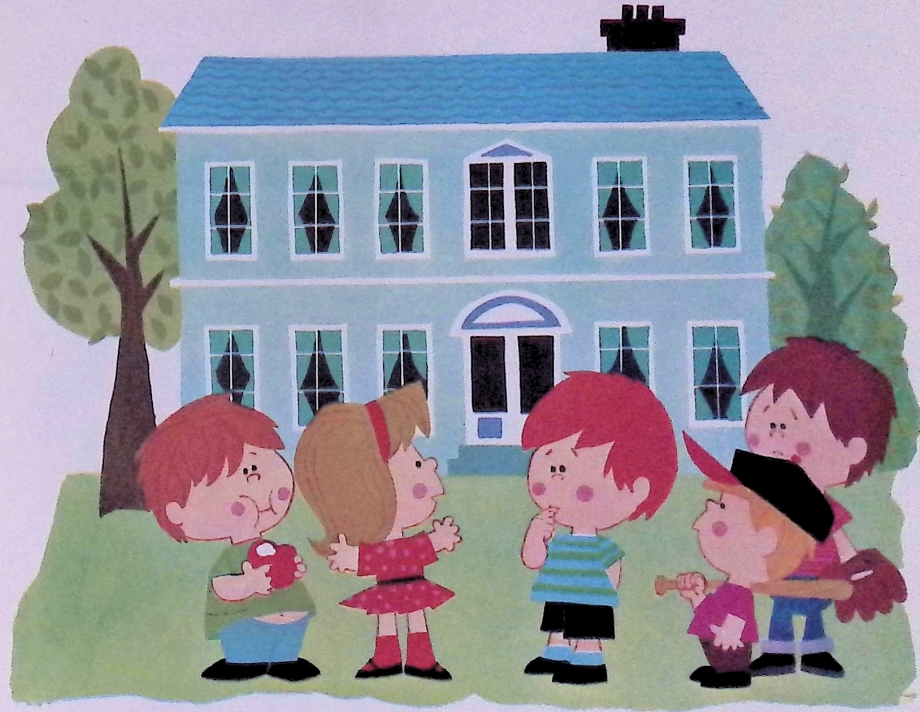

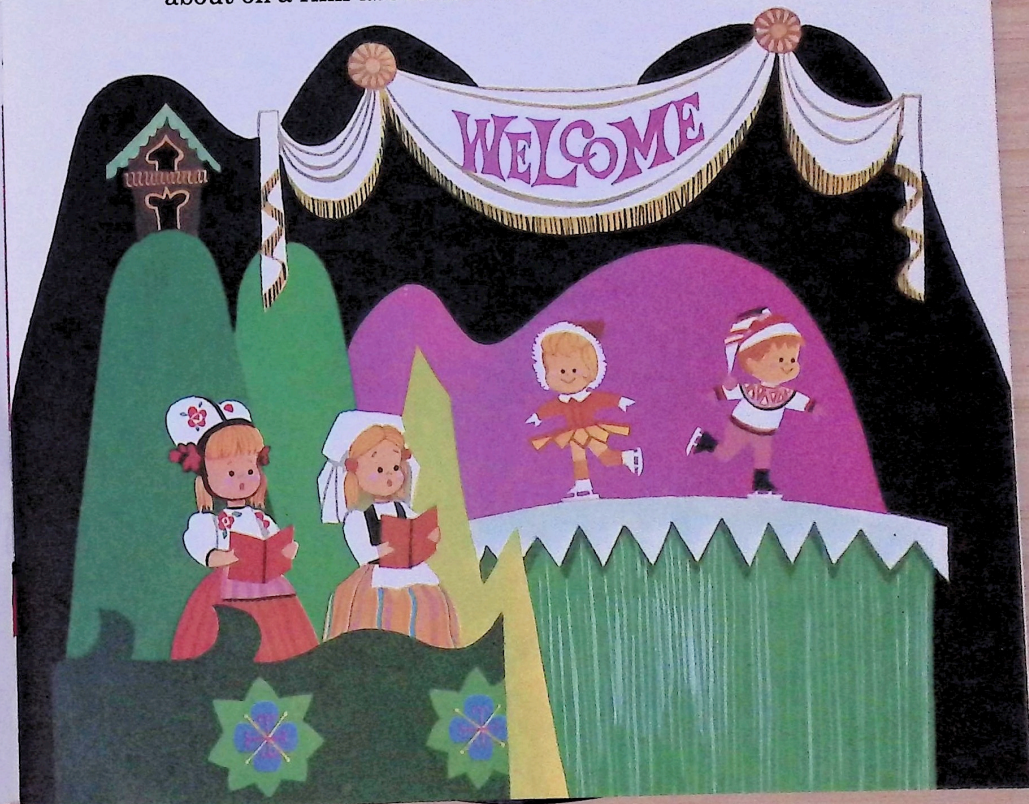

7 Then he heard English children singing to him from London Bridge and a little Scots Piper playing his bagpipes.

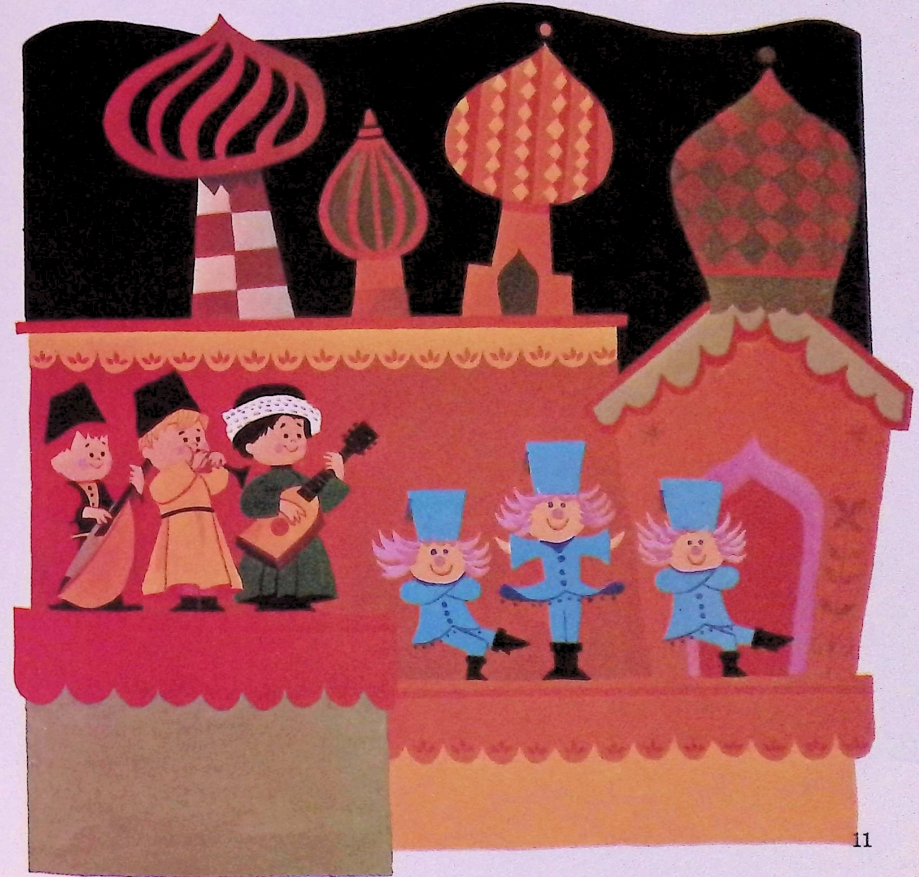
A flock of geese joined in the melody in Belgium, and in Holland boys and girls, seated on tulips, clicked their wooden shoes to keep time to the music.

In Russia a row of Cossacks danced to a Balalaika Band.



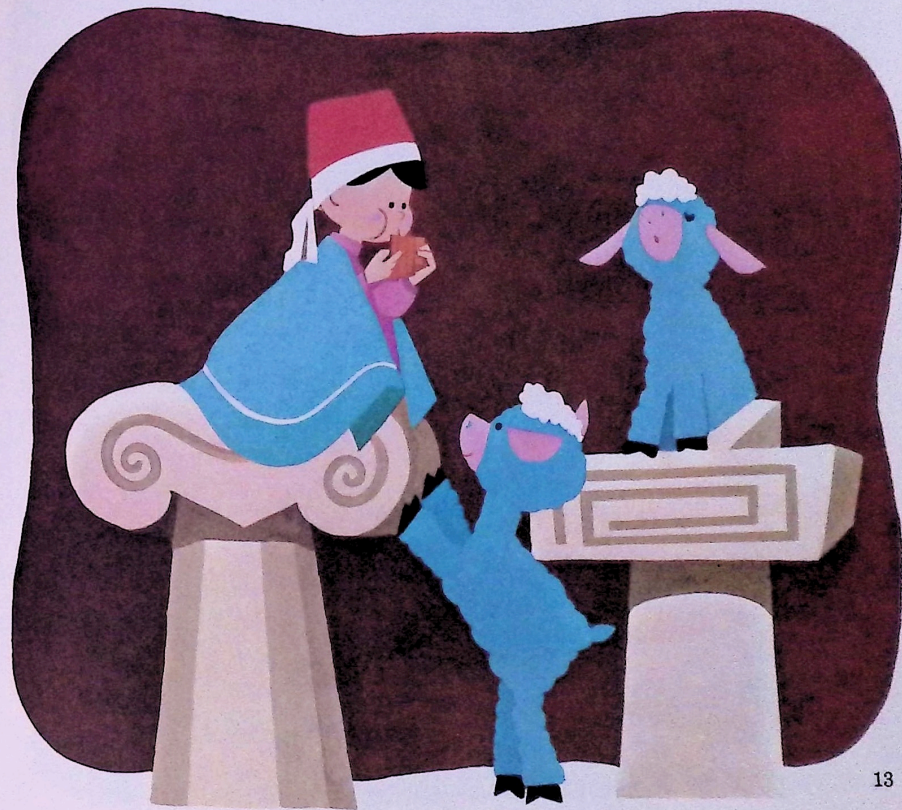

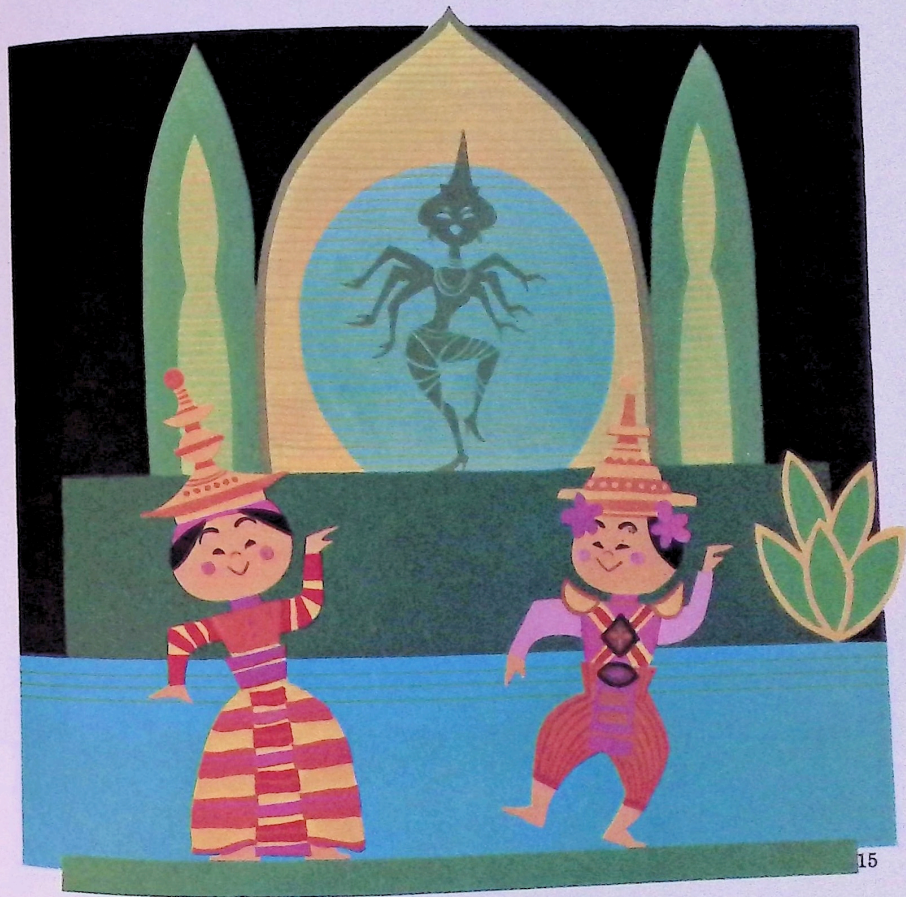




The sky in the Middle East was filled with magic flying carpets. What fun it would be to ride on one!

“Why, they’re all playing the same song!” thought Bobby.

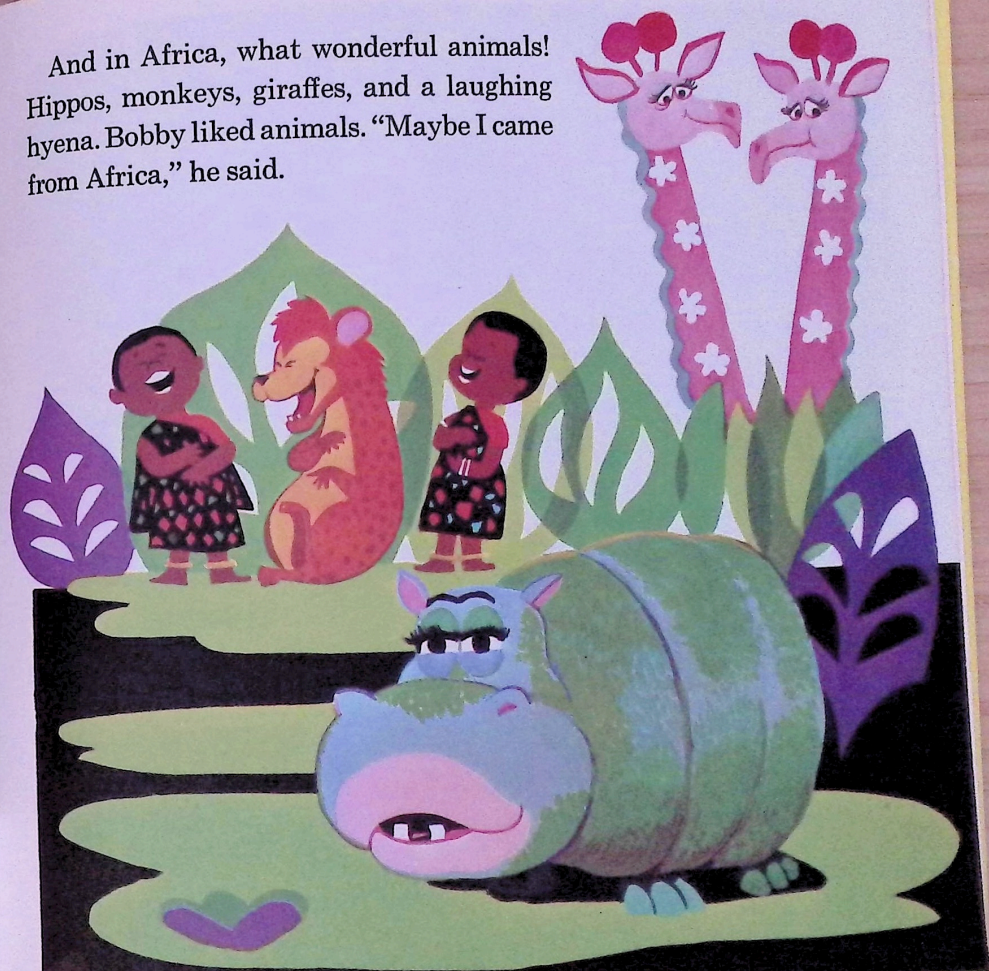






Japanese boys were flying dragon kites above an orange
