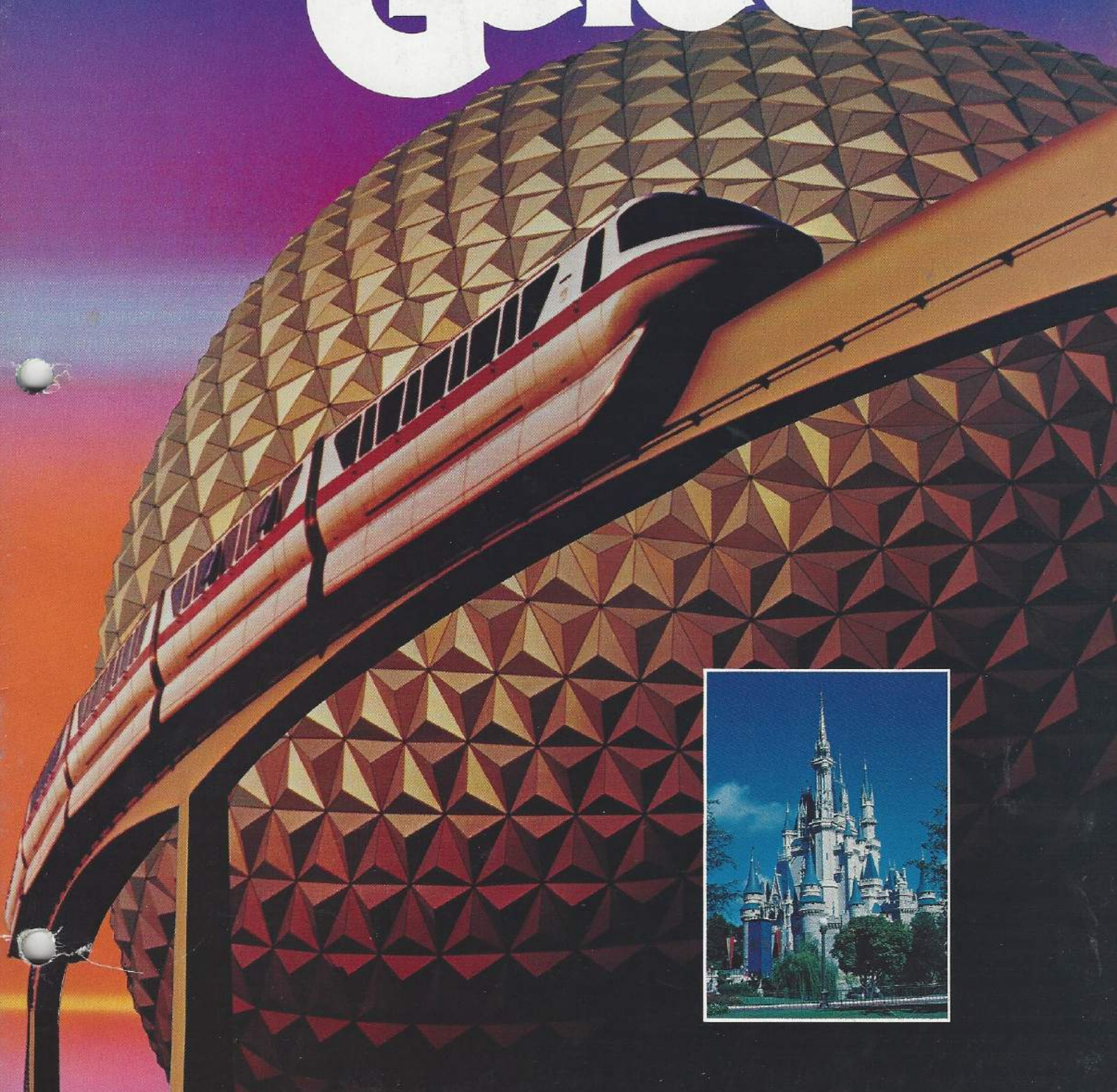

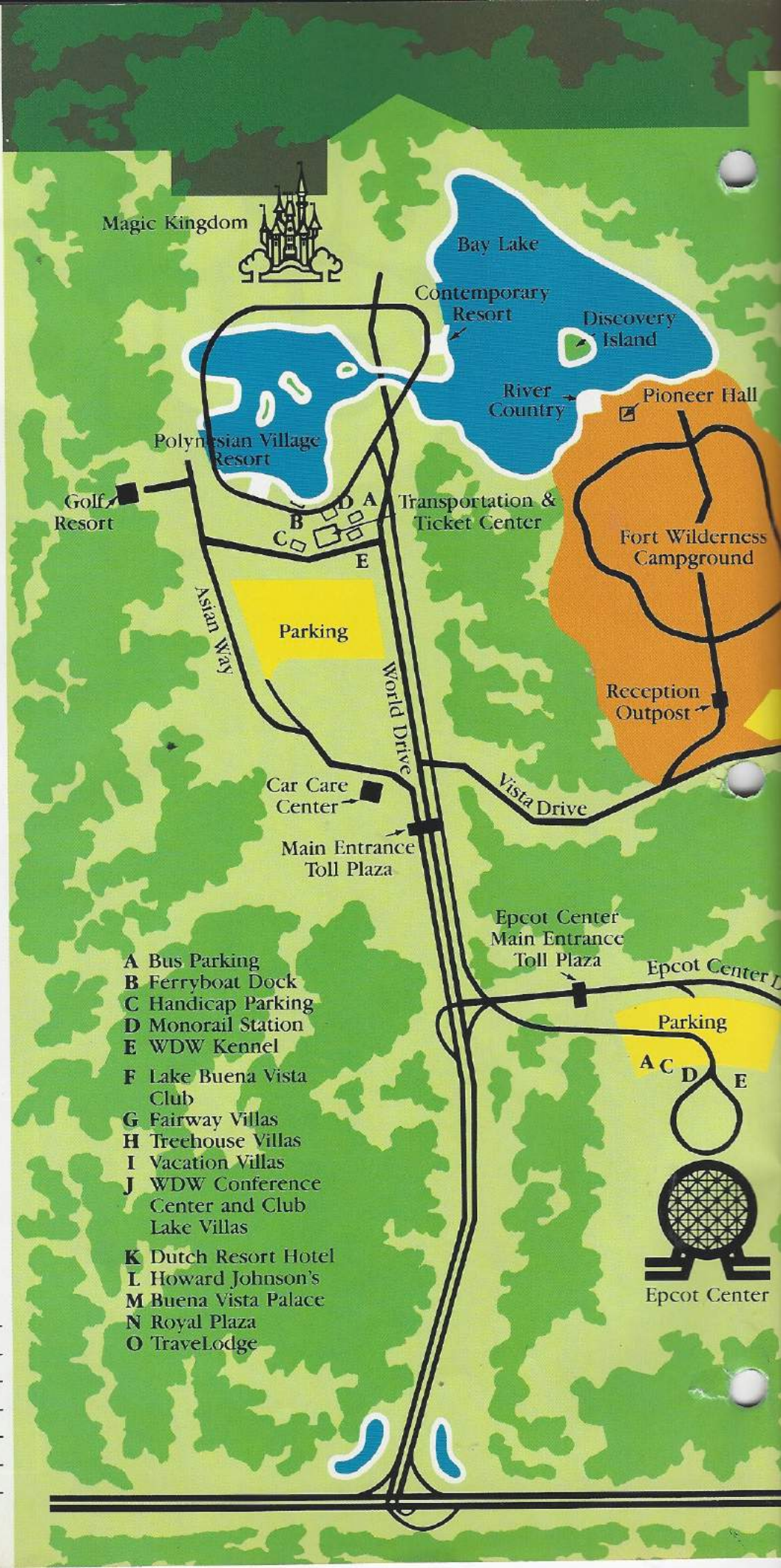
Welcome to Our World

Within the realms of Epcot Center, a family vacation becomes a series of adventures unparalleled in concept and form. Epcot Center represents the ultimate in Disney - "Imagineered" entertainment — an entertainment experience dedicated to mankind's most precious resource: Imagination.

Located on 600 acres of Walt Disney World property approximately two and a half miles from the Magic Kingdom, Epcot Center encompasses two distinct dimensions: Future World and World Showcase. Together they form a vast new showplace created to satisfy the imaginative appetites of the tens of millions of people of all ages destined to become "Epcot travelers."

FUTURE WORLD

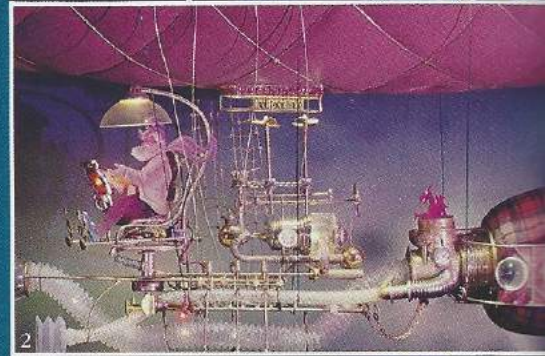
Standing 180 feet above the entrance, Epcot Center's colossal geosphere is your entrance to Future World. It is the largest structure of its kind anywhere, a dazzling statement to the extraordinary wonders that await you. Wonders in energy. In communications. In transportation. In the limitless potential of the seas... the land... and most of all, in the limitless potential of human imagination to chart the course for this our Spaceship Earth.

Spaceship Earth

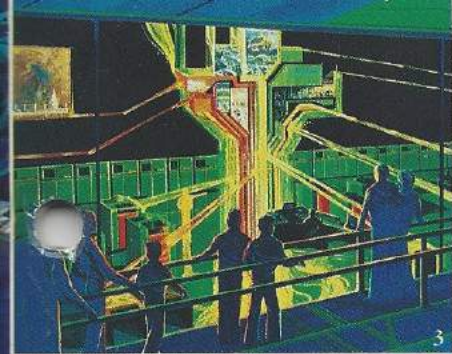
Within the vast interior of the Epcot Center geosphere you'll board Spaceship Earth, presented by the Bell System, for a spiraling journey through the history of communications. From the first images painted on cave walls to computers whose electronic pathways take you to the very edge of space, you'll see how communications has assured our survival through the ages.

Universe of Energy

Using the most complex film systems ever developed, and a multitude of dazzling special effects, the Universe of Energy, presented by Exxon, will take you from the great geological upheavals that enfolded fossil fuels deep within the earth, up to the present, and on to examine the energy forces of the future.

World of Motion

Three shows in one, World of Motion, presented by General Motors, takes you on a zany ride through milestones in transportation history. Another adventure awaits you in CenterCore, where you'll be dazzled by a six-story kaleidoscopic view of a futuristic landscape. And finally, you'll visit the General Motors Transcenter, presenting an exciting look at GM's advanced concepts for the present and future of transportation.

Journey Into Imagination

Almost castlelike in grandeur, Journey Into Imagination, presented by Kodak, is the fantasyland of Future World. From the Dreamport, you'll follow Dreamfinder and his delightful sidekick, Figment, into the wondrous worlds of art, literature, science and technology. In Image Works, you'll try your own hand at creative experiments. From there, you'll enter the Magic Journeys Theater for the largest — and perhaps most captivating — three-dimensional motion picture ever produced.

The Land

In the six-acre Land pavilion, presented by Kraft, you'll explore Nature in both her wildest and most cultivated states. You'll see actual experiments in futuristic farming. You'll feast in the rotating Good Turn restaurant. Plus, you'll enjoy a zany cast of incredible edibles at the Kitchen Kabaret serving up some of the most palatable entertainment this side of the refrigerator.

CommuniCore

Technology and people come together and make friends in CommuniCore, the Community Core of Future World. In an inviting cluster of buildings that welcome your participation, you'll converse with computers, cast your opinion on current issues, select and preview travel plans via videodisc and have your own "hands-on" experience with the 21st century.

Epcot Computer Central

One of the many exhibits in CommuniCore, Epcot Computer Central, presented by Sperry, gives you an up-close and entertaining look at the computer technology that helps run Walt Disney World and puts more than a thousand Audio-Animatronics performers through their paces.

Horizons (Opening 1983)

Horizons, presented by General Electric, will look at different lifestyles from the 21st century. And then let you choose one to try out yourself! You'll also take a look at today's world as it's never seen when you wind through the Omnisphere, presenting 8-story images of crystal formations, DNA molecules unfolding, and a fiery space shuttle blast-off, to name a few.

WORLD SHOWCASE

It would take a lifetime of vacations to explore the diverse countries of the world, discovering within each its own special ambience, charm and mystique. For most people, such adventure lives only in a dream. For travelers to Epcot Center's World Showcase, it is a dream come true.

Here, amidst nations standing in friendship beside a broad lagoon, you will live in one day what only weeks of world travel could surpass. You'll explore shops filled with unusual foreign goods. Dine in restaurants filled with the aroma of authentic foreign foods. And meet the young people of foreign lands, working together in a true family of man.

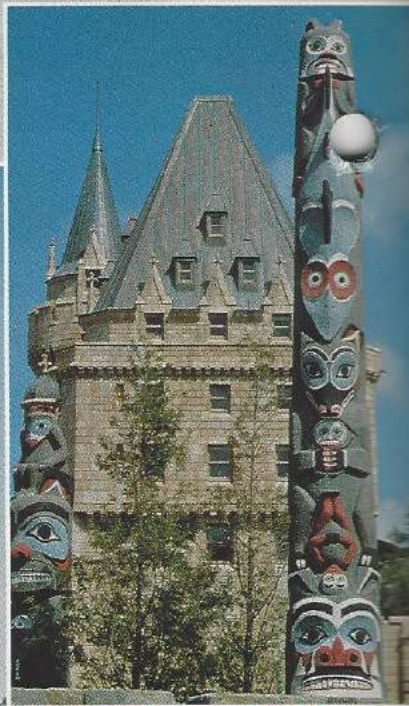
American Adventure

In the American Adventure, presented by American Express and Coca-Cola, you'll join Ben Franklin and Mark Twain for a soaring historical overview of America and her promising future. Perhaps the most breathtaking show ever presented about "the nation of many nations," the American Adventure is a theatrical production unparalleled in Disney annals — combining large-screen projection, inspiring music and special effects with performances by the most lifelike Audio-Animatronics figures ever developed.

Canada

From a northwest Indian village to a 19th century French chateau to the winding, narrow streets of Quebec City, the remarkable diversity of Canadian cultures and the awesome majesty of the wilderness are captured in the Canada pavilion. As a special highlight, Circle-Vision 360 presents, on screens ranged around a circular theater, "O Canada!" an exhilarating motion picture which puts you in the center of Canada's most exciting scenery.

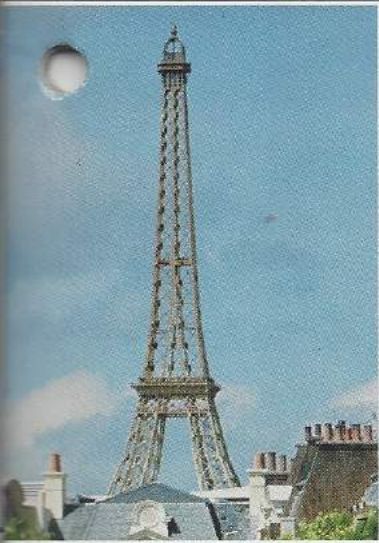
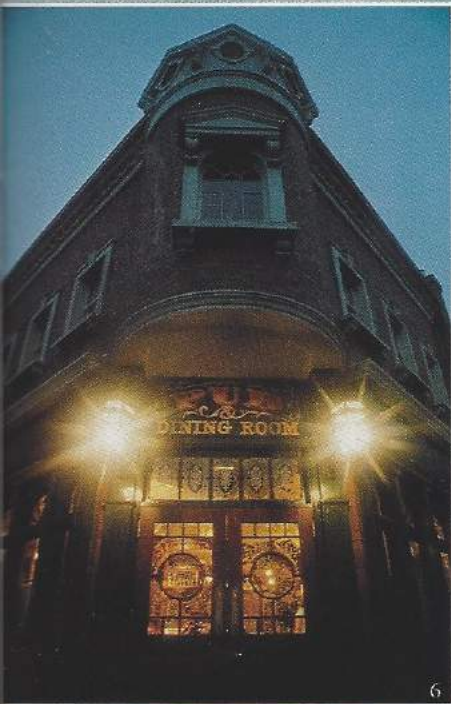

Mexico

Beyond the tall Mayan pyramid of the Mexico pavilion, you'll enter a lakeside pueblo village complete with shops, a cantina and a grumbling volcano. Among the many other delights is a dining adventure at the San Angel Inn, whose Mexico City counterpart enjoys world renown for incomparable cuisine. Nearby, you'll embark on a boat ride through Mexico's colorful past as told through the festival and dance of its great civilizations.

Japan

The elegance of old Japan is reborn in World Showcase. Formal bonsai gardens carved with paths, a meandering stream and waterfall surround an exquisite five-story pagoda. In the Grand Shishinden Hall, which houses a department store and restaurant by the internationally-celebrated Mitsukoshi, you'll watch Japanese master chefs perform culinary magic in spellbinding tableside presentations.

China

Beyond the ceremonial gate and spacious courtyard stands Disney's exquisite re-creation of the Beijing Temple of Heaven, centerpiece of the China pavilion. Inside, motion picture screens completely surround you in a Circle-Vision 360 presentation of China's dramatic landscapes, including the Great Wall, the Forbidden City and Summer Palace — sights that until now lay hidden from Western eyes.

United Kingdom

Green lawns, gabled rooftops, biscuit and china shops along cobblestone streets and a charming waterside pub provide a typically "British" setting for the United Kingdom pavilion. You'll meet the Pearly Kings and Queens, strolling troubadors and an Elizabethan poet named Will Shakespeare. From Tudor, Georgian and Victorian styles, English history comes to life in this kingdom-in-miniature.

France

Only in Epcot Center's France pavilion will the Pont des Arts and the Marketplace des Halles grace a Parisian landscape. These two venerable landmarks have long since vanished from the French capital. At Epcot Center they are part of the flavor and romance of Paris during "La Belle Epoque." Here, you'll also enjoy the classic cuisine of three internationally famous French chefs and a cinematic journey to France's most famous locales.

Germany

Where else could you celebrate Oktoberfest every day of every month? Amidst picturesque shops filled with porcelain dolls, cuckoo clocks and hand-carved music boxes, Germany's Biergarten in World Showcase will keep Oktoberfest in full swing, with beer in litre-high steins and an oom-pah band playing festive German music.

Italy

A Venetian canal takes you to St. Mark's Square at the Italy pavilion. Handcrafted leather goods, pottery and glass figurines fill the shops. In a richly detailed facsimile of the world-famous Doges Palace, you'll find a treasure-trove of fine art, jewelry and crystal, plus a splendid Italian restaurant operated by Alfredo's The Original of Rome.

A KINGDOM OF MAGIC

Childhood's fantasies come true for visitors of all ages in an extraordinary place known as the Magic Kingdom. Within its bounds are six themed lands, more than 40 attractions and over 70 restaurants and shops that fill at least two days with adventure.

The Magic Kingdom is open daily, and holidays and summers almost always mean the park will have extended hours and extra-special entertainment.

Main Street, U.S.A.

Walk through the Magic Kingdom entrance and you're on Main Street, U.S.A., the first of the six lands that make up the Magic Kingdom. It is the essence of hometown America at the turn of the last century — the crossroads of an era when the gas lamp was giving way to the electric light and the sputtering horseless carriage was challenging Old Dobbin for the streetcar right-of-way.

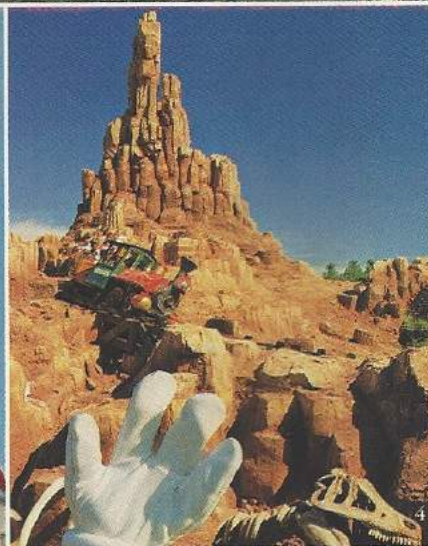
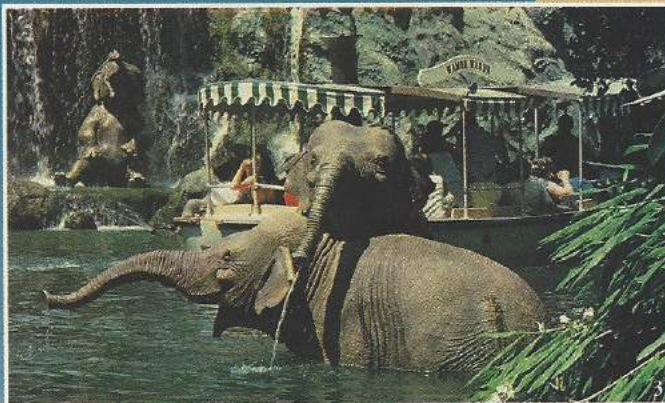
Browse in the Emporium and Market House, watch artisans at work in the glassware shop and silhouette studio, dine in the elegant Crystal Palace, or relive the days of silent films and penny arcades. Each afternoon a band concert performs in the central park of Town Square. And at least once a day marching bands, merrily whirling floats and Disney characters turn Main Street, U.S.A. into a Fourth of July.

Before you leave, be sure to visit the "Walt Disney Story" in the Hospitality House. In rare film footage, Walt tells his own story, from childhood to the creation of Walt Disney World, and provides insight into the philosophies of the Disney organization.

Adventureland

"It's a jungle out there," when you leave Main Street, U.S.A. and begin your safari through Adventureland. Here, you can board a launch for a "Jungle Cruise" through untamed lands and waterways where elephants, hippos, tigers and snakes threaten at every bend.

The tour safely completed, you can step back on dry ground and encounter the enchantment of the South Seas. Birds, flowers and tiki gods gather regularly for a "Tropical Serenade."

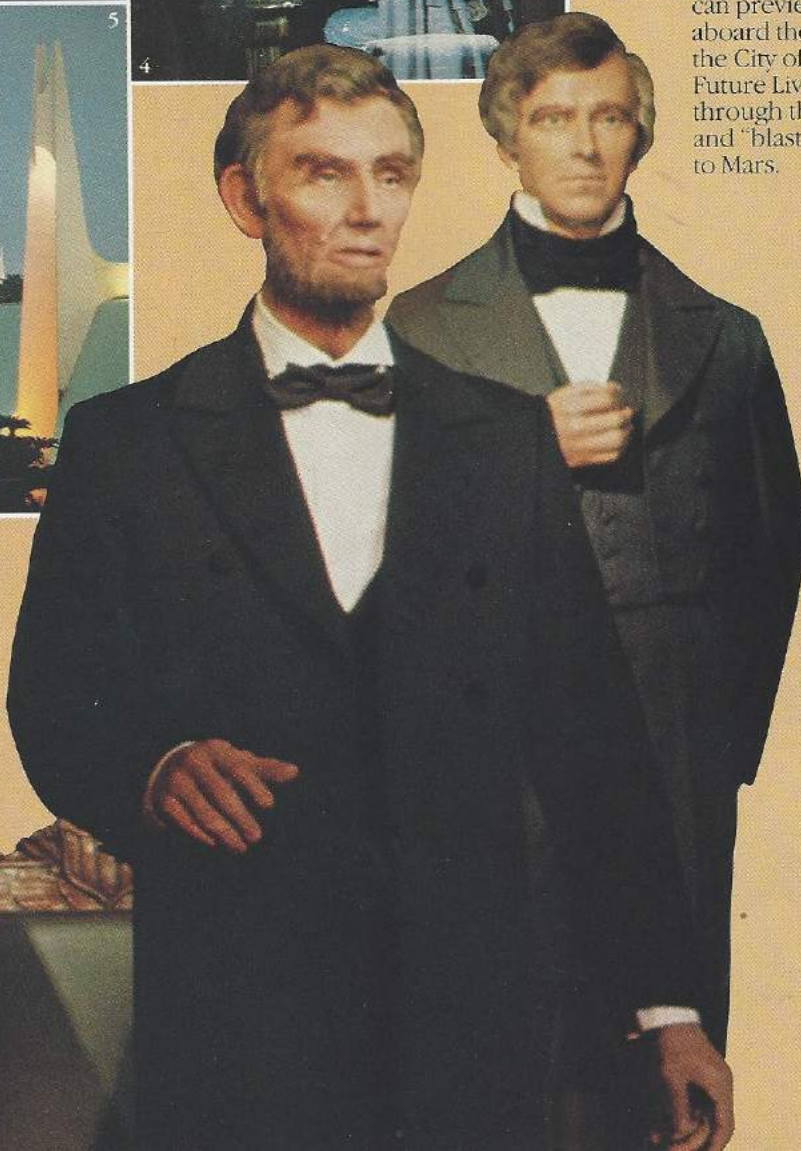
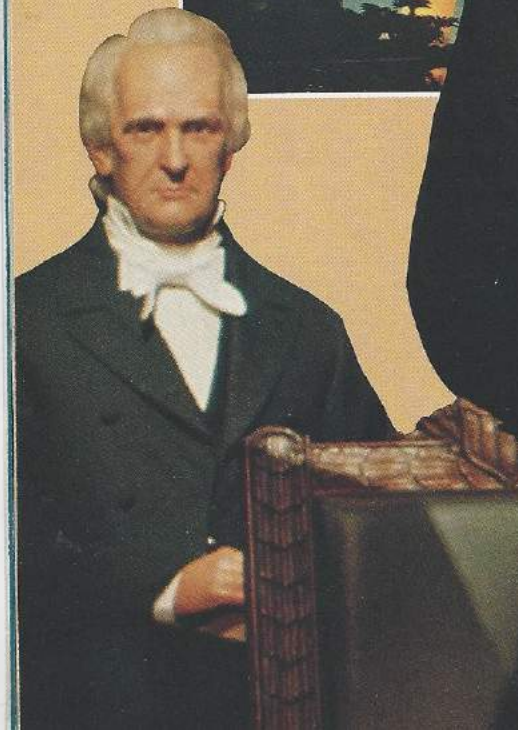
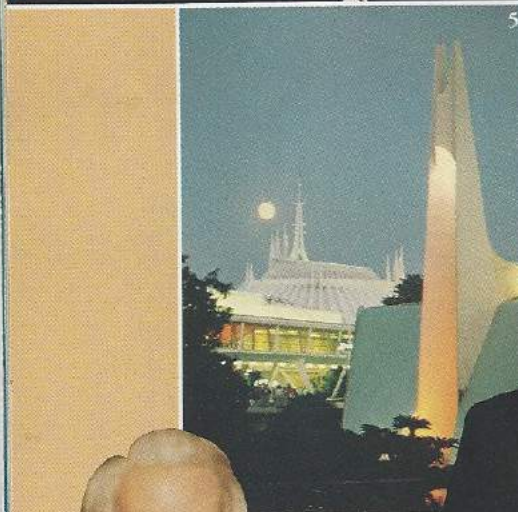
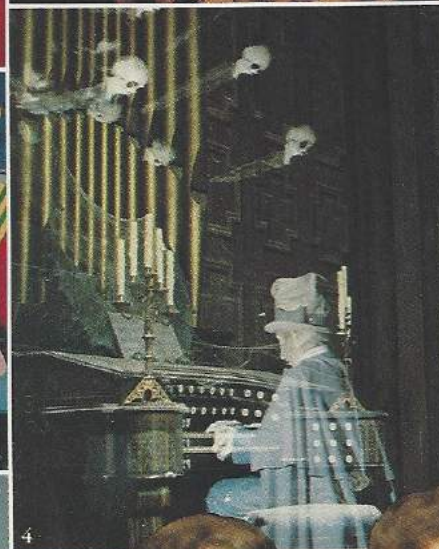
Your true test of courage comes later when you unsuspectingly sail amidst the "Pirates of the Caribbean" raucously rejoicing their rampage of the old Spanish Main.

Frontierland

The sounds of steamboat whistles, strumming banjos and country tunes fill the streets while two rootin'-tootin' stage shows — the rollicking Diamond Horseshoe Revue and the hilarious Country Bear Jamboree — keep things lively inside. Hardy pioneers and true thrill-seekers can challenge Big Thunder Mountain Railroad. During your journey on this "runaway" mine train, you'll encounter swarming bats, a thundering waterfall, an underground earthquake and an avalanche.

Liberty Square

When Abraham Lincoln rises from his stage chair to speak, all the presidents of the United States listen. Uncannily lifelike, the Audio-Animatronics recreations of every Chief Executive from Washington to Reagan appear in the dramatic show presented in the Hall of Presidents.



Elsewhere in Liberty Square, spirits of another sort fill the stone-faced Haunted Mansion. The apparitions who have taken up housekeeping in the old estate on the hill are 999 of the happiest and most mischievous spirits in the World.

Fantasyland

Standing at the heart of the Magic Kingdom, the golden-spired Cinderella Castle is your gateway to Fantasyland. Set within the castle grounds, Fantasyland is a timeless land of enchantment, dedicated to those who believe that "When you wish upon a star, your dreams come true."

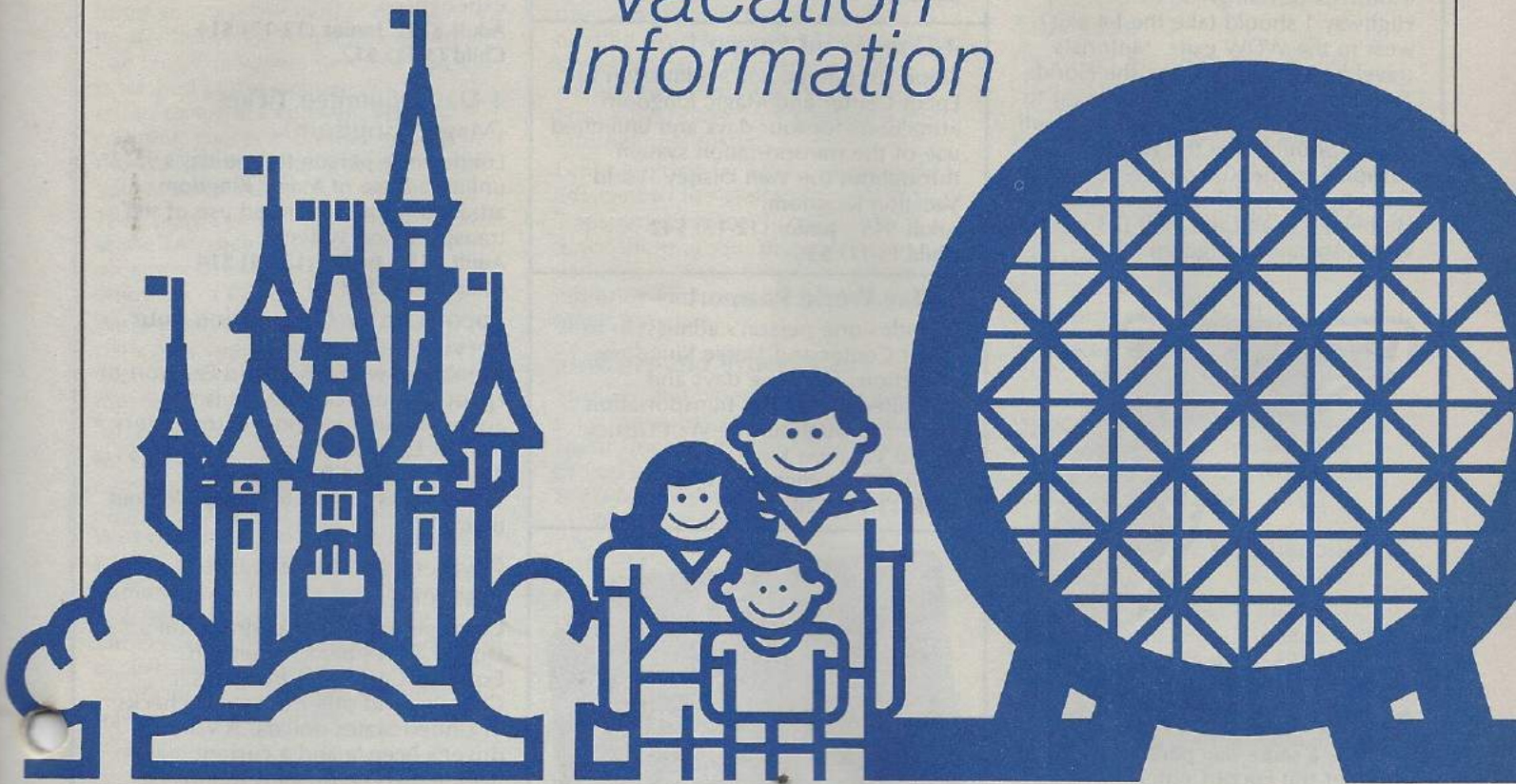
Here, you'll find flying elephants, twirling teacups and a glittering carrousel whose noble steeds carry you off to worlds of make-believe. You'll also find a tropical lagoon where Nautilus-styled submarines take you to "20,000 Leagues Under the Sea." Or you can join the children of the world on the happiest cruise that ever sailed, learning along the way that "It's a Small World, After All."

Tomorrowland

Aboard the Fantasyland Skyway, you can glide above the Magic Kingdom into Tomorrowland, where the adventures of the future await you today. Here, you can preview tomorrow's transportation aboard the WEDway PeopleMover, visit the City of Tomorrow and the Home of Future Living, take a free-falling race through the wonders of Space Mountain and "blast off" on a fact-filled Mission to Mars.

Transportation to the Walt Disney World Vacation Kingdom

Commercial Airlines: Both Orlando International Airport, approximately 20 miles from the Walt Disney World Vacation Kingdom, and Tampa International Airport, approximately 75 miles away, are served by many major airlines. Eastern Airlines, the Official Airline of Walt Disney World, has more flights to Orlando from more cities in the United States than any other airline.

Private Aircraft: Orlando Executive Airport, approximately 25 miles away, and Kissimmee Airport, 10 miles away, serve both private and corporate aircraft.

Amtrak: Daily service to Orlando is provided both northbound and southbound for the Eastern Seaboard and Midwestern United States. For information, call Amtrak's toll-free number (800) 342-2520.

Greyhound: Regular connecting service is available between the Walt Disney World Vacation Kingdom and Greyhound's entire transportation network. Local service from

downtown Orlando is also available, with schedules dependent on Epcot Center and Magic Kingdom operating hours.

National Car Rental: The official car rental company of Disneyland and Walt Disney World. To reserve your car, call (800) 328-4567; in Minnesota (800) 862-6064.

American Sightseeing: Daily connecting service to most flights is available between Orlando International Airport and the Walt Disney World Vacation Kingdom.

Grayline of Orlando: Local service from the downtown terminal on the corner of West Pine and West Central to the Walt Disney World Vacation Kingdom is available every two hours beginning at 8 a.m., with stops at major hotels and motels en route. Return trips depart the Walt Disney World Transportation and Ticket Center every two hours beginning at 9 a.m. until ½-hour after Epcot Center or the Magic Kingdom closes.

For additional facts on transportation, please contact your travel agent or the airlines, train or bus representative in your area.

The Walt Disney World Vacation Kingdom is located off U.S. Highway 192 near the intersection of the Florida Turnpike and Interstate 4. Motorists traveling I-95 or U.S. Highway 1 should take the I-4 exit west to the WDW exits. Motorists traveling I-75 should take the Florida Turnpike to the I-4 exit, then west to the WDW exits. Motorists from South Florida should take the Florida Turnpike to the Kissimmee-St. Cloud interchange, which connects U.S. Highway 192 and the Walt Disney World Vacation Kingdom.



Parking

There is a same-day parking fee of \$1 at either the Epcot Center or Magic Kingdom Auto Plazas (\$2 for recreational vehicles and trailers). **Special areas are provided for handicapped parking.**

Guests holding confirmed Walt Disney World resort reservations will be given a parking pass and directions to their resort where ample parking will be available without charge.

Epcot Center and the Magic Kingdom

Tips on Your Visit

A **three-day** visit is recommended for maximum enjoyment of Epcot Center and the Magic Kingdom. A **fourth day** allows you time to have lunch in one of the Walt Disney World resorts, explore the tropical paradise of Discovery Island, splash at River Country or browse around Walt Disney World Village.

Epcot Center and the Magic Kingdom are open every day of the year. Summer season features extended hours while fall, winter, and spring seasons have adjusted shorter hours, with extended hours during certain holiday periods and special events. When extended hours are in effect, fireworks are presented at 10 p.m. (does not include special events).

Since it takes at least three days to enjoy all of Epcot Center and the Magic Kingdom, we recommend the extra-value three- or four-day unlimited passport.

4-Day World Passport

Good for one person's admission to Epcot Center and Magic Kingdom attractions for four days and unlimited use of the transportation system throughout the Walt Disney World Vacation Kingdom.

3-Day World Passport

Includes one person's admission to Epcot Center and Magic Kingdom attractions for three days and unlimited use of the transportation system throughout the Walt Disney World Vacation Kingdom.

1-Day Unlimited Ticket (Epcot Center)

Entitles one person to one day's unlimited use of all Epcot Center experiences.

1-Day Unlimited Ticket (Magic Kingdom)

Entitles one person to one day's unlimited use of Magic Kingdom attractions and unlimited use of the transportation system.

Epcot Center Orientation Tour Service

Combined with any World Passport or Epcot Center ticket media is an approximate three-hour introductory tour of Epcot Center.

Payment for Tickets and Passports

Cash, personal checks drawn on a United States bank, American Express® Cards and Traveler's Cheques and other traveler's checks in United States dollars. A valid driver's license and a current major bank-issued credit card will be required before a personal check is accepted.

Pets

Pets are not permitted in Epcot Center, the Magic Kingdom or the resorts. However, they may stay in one of three air-conditioned kennels.



Please, do not leave pets in your car.

The Walt Disney World Kennel Club is conveniently located adjacent to the Transportation and Ticket Center and provides comfortable quarters for pets of Magic Kingdom and resort hotel guests. (The kennel closes one hour after Magic Kingdom closing.) The Fort Wilderness Kennel and Livery is located at the campground entrance for the convenience of camping guests and those staying in the Walt Disney World Village Resort Villa accommodations.

The Epcot Center Kennel Club located at the Entrance Plaza can accommodate your pet while you enjoy Epcot Center.

We suggest that you provide your pet's own supply of food. Please exercise your pet frequently since they are confined.

Advance reservations are not accepted.

Rates are \$3.50 per day and \$4.50 per night per pet. (Pet night rate is for Walt Disney World resort guests only.)

Florida law requires proof of immunization for any animal involved in a biting incident. To avoid any unnecessary delays if such an incident occurs, visitors are advised to bring certification of vaccination when traveling with their pets.

Transportation

A transportation ticket entitles you to an entire day's use of the monorails (which connect the Transportation and Ticket Center with the Magic Kingdom and Epcot Center, the Contemporary Resort and Polynesian Village Resort hotels), the ferryboats (which connect the Magic Kingdom and the Transportation and Ticket Center), and shuttle service between the Walt Disney World Village and the Walt Disney World resorts and the Transportation and Ticket Center.

Guests who wish to return to Epcot Center and the Magic Kingdom the same day must have their hand stamped before exiting for readmission without additional charge.

Please note: For your safety, shoes and shirts must be worn at all times in Epcot Center and the Magic Kingdom and aboard all transportation system vehicles.

Purchase of a one-day Epcot Center ticket does not include transportation. It is however, included in the multiday passports.

All Walt Disney World resort guests receive unlimited use of the entire transportation system connecting all

destinations within the Walt Disney World complex.

Epcot Center and Magic Kingdom Dining

Epcot Center and the Magic Kingdom offer a wide selection of restaurants ranging from snacks and fast food to buffeterias and waitress service restaurants with most World Showcase restaurants specialize in international dishes.

Limited picnic facilities are available adjacent to the Walt Disney World Transportation and Ticket Center. Since there are no picnic facilities within the Magic Kingdom, **please do not bring food to Epcot Center or the Magic Kingdom.**

Strollers and Wheelchairs

Strollers and wheelchairs are available on a rental basis at the entrance to Epcot Center and the Magic Kingdom, or you may bring your own. Rates: \$1.50 for strollers, \$1 for wheelchairs, \$1.50 deposit required.

Lockers

Rental locker facilities are located at the Transportation and Ticket Center, Entrance Plaza in Epcot Center, or beneath the Main Street Railroad Station inside the Magic Kingdom.

Banking Services

Sun Banks are located on Main Street, U.S.A., just inside the Magic Kingdom, at the Entrance Plaza at Epcot Center (open daily 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.) and in the Sun Bank Building just across the boulevard from Walt Disney World Village (open 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday, except Thursdays — 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.; drive-through tellers are open 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday). Both offer a complete line of banking services including:

- Exchanging of foreign currency;
- Issuing of cashier's checks and money orders;
- Cashing and refunding of traveler's checks;
- American Express® Traveler's Cheques, sales and emergency check cashing for American Express® Cards and bank-issued credit cards.

The preceding services are also available at the Entrance Plaza in Epcot Center.

Merchandise may be purchased with cash, traveler's checks, or American Express® Cards. Foreign currency exchange facilities are also available at the Guest Relations window at the Transportation and Ticket Center, the Main Street Station (2nd floor) inside

the Magic Kingdom, and the cashier's desk at each Walt Disney World resort. For American Express cardholders, currency exchange is available at TravelPort in CommuniCore East at Epcot Center.

Baby Care

The Magic Kingdom Baby Center, presented by Gerber, (adjacent to Crystal Palace Restaurant) provides an area for nursing mothers and facilities for changing infants, preparing formulas and warming bottles. Disposable diapers, baby bottles, formula, pacifiers and limited selections of baby food are available at a nominal fee.

Additional services available near the Odyssey Restaurant in Epcot Center.

Sorry, babysitting service is not available inside Epcot Center or the Magic Kingdom. Babysitting service is available at the resort hotels for registered Walt Disney World resort guests only.

Information for Handicapped Guests

Handicapped parking is located adjacent to the Transportation and Ticket Center and at the Entrance Plaza in Epcot Center. Inquire at the Auto Plazas for directions.

The ferryboats are the easiest means of transportation to the Magic Kingdom for guests in wheelchairs. Guests may also ride the monorails; however, it is NOT possible to board or leave the monorail at the Contemporary Resort Hotel. Special transportation arrangements may be made at City Hall.

Special assistance for blind guests is available at City Hall where they can obtain complimentary taped tour cassettes. Cassette players require a \$5 refundable deposit.

All handicapped guests are invited to stop by City Hall in the Magic Kingdom or Earth Station located in Epcot Center for complete information.



World Cruise

Enjoy a narrated World Cruise around the Walt Disney World Bay Lake and Seven Seas Lagoon aboard an authentic side-wheeler. Along the way your captain will put in for a fascinating tour of Discovery Island's beautiful birds and exotic plant life.
